

SAFETY GATE ALERTS IN 2018

The vast majority of toys are made by reputable companies who invest time and money in safety.

Reputable companies:

- Put toys through stringent testing procedures
- Make sure products are easily identifiable
- Have processes in place to quickly address any issues that could occur
- Demonstrate their responsibility by joining toy associations

96% of toy alerts linked to illegal traders. Around 2 in 5 were from "ghost companies" that cannot be traced.

To make toys even safer, EU authorities should:

Focus on suspect traders Take action to deter repeat offenders Ensure sellers are accountable – whether selling online or in brick and mortar stores
